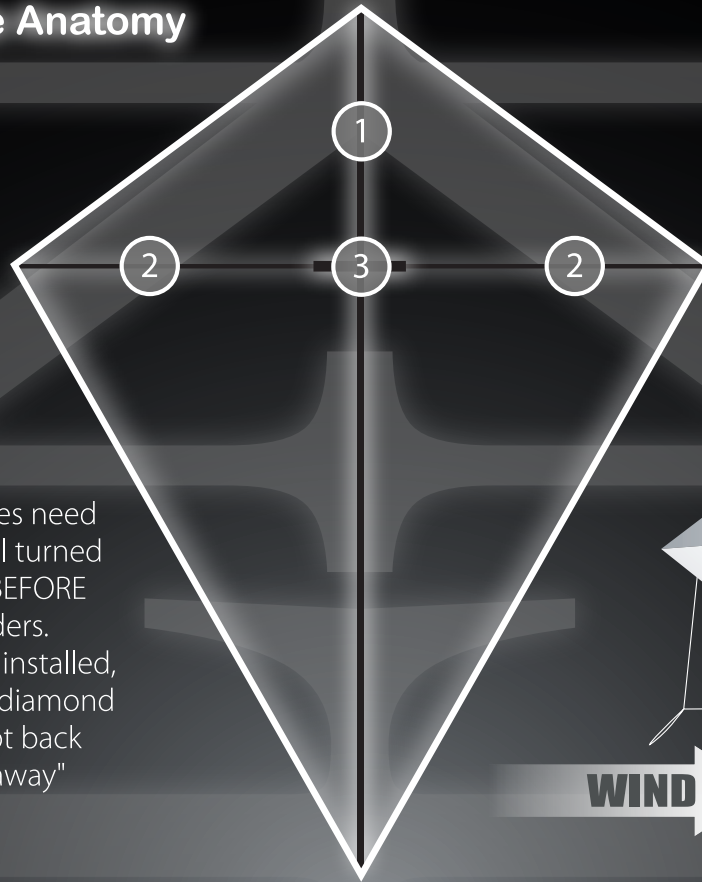


Basic

Diamond Kite Anatomy

1. Center Spine
2. Spreaders x2
3. Dihedral

NOTE: Diamond kites need to have the Dihedral turned to the correct side BEFORE inserting the Spreaders. Once Spreaders are installed, the wingtips of the diamond kite should be swept back (see Figure 1) and "away" from the flier.

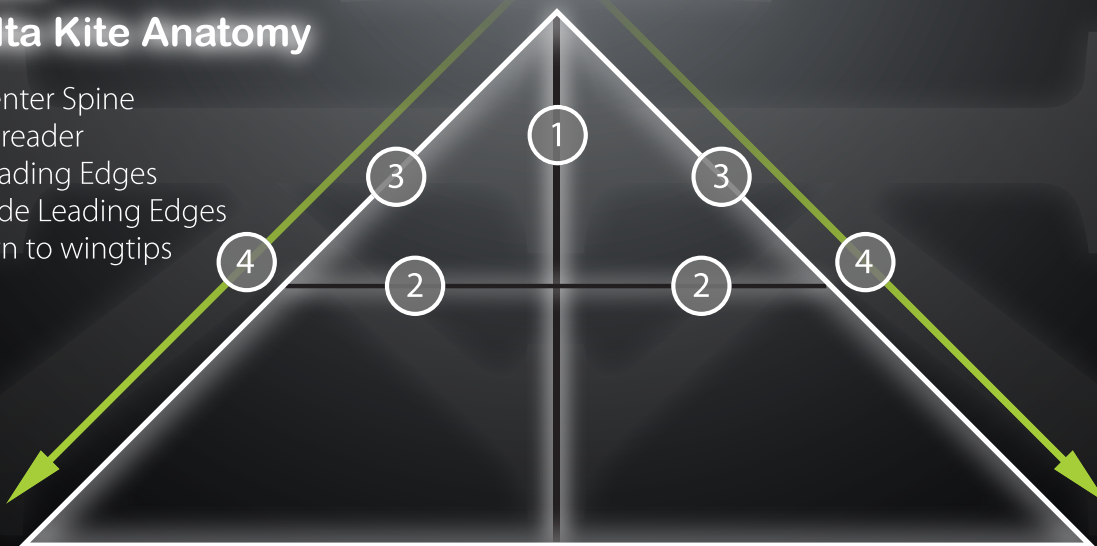

Delta Kite Anatomy

1. Center Spine
2. Spreader
3. Leading Edges
4. Slide Leading Edges Down to wingtips



NOTE: Delta kites tend to have the Leading Edge rods pushed up towards the nose. These rods need to be pushed down towards the wingtips BEFORE flight. Also, make sure that when inserting the Spreader into the left and right pockets, that the Spreader is not UNDER the Center Spine. The Spreader should be free to move and bend back without being restricted by the Center Spine.
